The Secretary apologized for the minutes and the Treasurer's report being sent late. He asked the attendees if any objections to the AGM being carried out. There was no objection from all those in attendance, including those online. The Secretary did not receive any objections prior to the meeting from any 1,400 members who were informed of the AGM. The AGM continued with approval from the floor.

1. WELCOME NOTE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE MALAYSIAN PHYSIOTHERAPY ASSOCIATION

The President welcomed all those attending for coming to the 59th Annual General Meeting of the Malaysian Physiotherapy Association and thanked all members for taking the time to attend the AGM. The President continued with his address in the President's Report.

2. ATTENDANCE AND APOLOGY

Invitations were sent to 1,400 active members through the website. Two hundred forty members responded and confirmed attending, but only 106 attended in person and online. Twenty members apologized for being unable to attend the 59th Annual General Meeting 2022.

3. PRESIDENTS REPORT FOR 2021

This committee was nominated in 2021 for the period 2021-2023. The President highlighted that Pn. Halizahanim, the Assistant Secretary, resigned from her position in late 2021 due to work responsibilities, so the position remains vacant until the next AGM, where a new Assistant Secretary will be elected.

3.1 The MPA successfully organized the 58th AGM and National Physiotherapy Seminar from 10 to 12 September 2021 during the pandemic, and it was the first time we had organized the event online. It was in conjunction with World Physiotherapy Day 2021. It was officiated by the President of World Physio, Jonathan Kruger, and the President of the AWP Western Pacific, Prof Suh-Fang, Jeng from Taiwan, both of whom attended via the online Zoom

Platform. There were plenary talks and breakaway con-current seminars during the event that received a very good response and appreciation from the physiotherapist nationwide.

3.2 To strengthen the association, the SIG Committee incorporated leaders in each field to lead the individual SIG. The committee included the following:

Each SIG has developed a Facebook page to communicate with members about their activities. Mr. President encouraged members to follow and like the pages. All SIG's groups have their own committees.

3.3 MPA JOURNAL 2022

3.4 MEMBERSHIP DRIVE

For the year 2021, the total number of active members listed is 1,788, and student members were 268. In 2020 the Active members were 800. This is an increase of 120% and shows a good trend for more people joining the association. This is a good achievement as it is part of the MPAs goal to increase members in the MPA.

3.5 ACT 774: MALAYSIAN ALLIED HEALTH PROFESSION COUNCIL

Mr President, as part of the Council member, attended the amendment to the Second Schedule (Jadual Kedua) on 4 October 2021. The proposed amendment has been approved and will be phased out in 2022.

Some of these webinars were made possible because of the work of the SIG team. EXCO cannot organize these events without the help of these groups. These SIG groups will bring leaders and experts in each field to the forefront so they can be recognized for their contribution to the profession. In organizing these Webinars, we identified therapists specialized in specific areas, e.g., Men's Health, Woman's Health, Hand, etc. and continue to identify more in the process of the development of these SIG's.

3.7 WORLD PHYSIOTHERAPY SUB-GROUPS

MPA is involved in 2 main subgroups. The first is the International Society for Electrophysical Agents in Physical Therapy (iSEAPT). The other is for Hydrotherapy or Aquatics, The International Organization of Aquatic Physical Therapists (IOAPT). Currently, Mr Dhanaraj is the person of contact in Malaysia representing MPA for courses relating to hydrotherapy, and we are looking to help him develop the field.

3.8 WELFARE AND DONATIONS

The President expressed his gratitude to Pn. Nur Hidayah, Pn. Halizahanim and Pn. Kelly Shu for spearheading the CSR for our therapists around hospitals in the country. This past year, we focused on East Malaysia in Miri, Bintulu, Sibu, Hospital Umum Sarawak, Labuan and 2 hospitals in Negri Sembilan, Hospital Tunku Jaffar Seremban and Hospital Tuanku Ampuan Najihah, Kuala Pilah. We provided PPE to our therapists in these hospitals.

3.9 BACAAN YASIN AND DOA SELAMAT

Bacaan Yasin and Doa Selamat were offered to all therapists in the country for their health and well-being. Prayers were also offered to those who died in 2021 during the pandemic. The prayers were done online via Zoom on 8 August and 12 August 2021.

4. CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE 58TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The minutes were approved without objections or corrections.

5. MATTERS ARISING FROM THE 58TH ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

5.1 Change in the Constitution

We are in the process of amending the constitution. We have had one online zoom meeting to amend the constitution with Datin Sharifah, Datin Khadijah, Datin Asiah, and the Exco. The effort is under process, and we will continue to review the constitution and, we hope, be able to present it at the next AGM. The process is extensive, and doing it online is a little bit of a challenge.

5.2 Secretariat

The Vice President mentioned that the name change had been made and the sale process was underway. Currently, no parties are interested. We may look to sell the unit below 190k. Renovation may be needed to make it presentable to a prospective buyer.

The President clarified that 3 agents had been appointed. The last price set was 250k, and the agent said the price was too high. The agent suggested and sell between 150 to 190k. The EXCO feels it is a waste to renovate the unit for 10 to 15k. There have been requests to rent the unit at 1k per month. However, those who have shown interest are foreigners. We will see selling the unit as a priority.

5.3 State Representative

Mr President clarified that the discussions with state presidents showed that not all states were keen to join MPA in a partnership manner. The proposal to the state representatives did not receive a favorable response. The President will continue the discussion with the individual state associations. His current aim is to co-organise events with them to build a relationship and slowly bring them back to the parent body.

5.4 MPA Journal

The MPA Journal has been registered with ISBN. We are allowed to publish 2 journals per year, but for 2022 we will start with 1 volume. For the following year, Mr President will call for the abstract and during the conference will be ready for March 2023. The current journal, 2023, is complete and available for the members.

5.6 Special Interest Group

The SIG is divided into 2 parts. The 1st part is the Core Committee which may contain 5 to 6 members. The second part is open to therapists interested in a specific area of focus as members of the SIG group. Currently, the SIG group consists of MPA members and non-members. The President requested more members to join the SIG group and participate in their respective groups.

In closing, the President hoped that the members were satisfied with the work done by the committee this past year and thanked the EXCO for supporting the effort. The EXCO had to respond at odd hours by the EXCO. He also thanked Andrew and Shu for the membership approval.

6. FINANCIAL REPORT

6.1 We have maintained the Auditors with Lo & CO. for 2021.

6.2 For the year 2021, the MPA carried a net surplus of RM171,784 balance carried forward—an increase of 15.6% from 2020.

6.3 Income statement with an increase of 77.6% and an increase of RM124,258.00. This is contributed by the membership fees, which show an increase of 108.5%, a total of RM133,245.00. Overall, there is an after-tax surplus of 59.4%, a total of RM64,003.00, ending 2021.

6.4 Expenditure showed an increase of 117.7% to a total of RM 60,899 in 2021. The main cost was the upgrade to the website, which cost RM21,350.00. The new system and website is more admin friendly and interactive for members. The other cost was the subscription fees for members, including Annual Fee to World Physio and AWP. Mdm. Chelvi asked about the Consultation fee, which was 21k. This is the fee for the Secretariat to do the admin work. The term Consultation was used as an audit term. The fee is from November 2020 to December 2021, which is RM1,500 per month.

6.5 Cash flow from operating activities shows an increase of 15.8% to a total of RM168,943 in Dec 2021. The MPA had a total of RM1,069,093 on 31 December 2020. (Total of RM776,471 from the fixed deposit and RM292,622 Cash bank balance in the bank). An increase of 11.2%

6.6 As of 2 July 2022, the current bank balance was RM381,313.77. We currently have 2 FDs with CIMB. The total amount in FD is RM943, 925.64. The total cash and FD is RM1,325,239.41.

6.7 Mr Andrew Reggie inquired about the membership subscription, showing an increase of 24%. Mdm. Treasurer explained that for 2021 the MPA paid for 1,469 members at £1.53 per member and the iPay 88 platforms for the online payment service, which totalled RM13,645, an increase of 20%.

6.9 The members in attendance accepted the financial report without objection.

7. STATE REPRESENTATIVE REPORT

We continue to engage with the State Physiotherapy Associations to have any events to help support. This past year 2021, there were no events to report.

8. ANY OTHER BUSINESS.

8.1 Events and activities

The President requested all members to view the website and the MPA Facebook social media to be aware of any activities planned by the association. He went on to promote the coming event in September,

8.1.1. National Physiotherapy Workshop in September 2022.

There will be 4 workshops:

1. Dry Needling Certification Level 1
2. Early Rehabilitation in Respiratory Care in ICU
3. High-Velocity Low-Amplitude Thrust Manipulation
4. Vestibular Rehabilitation by Prof Alia from World Physio

Mr President hopes to connect with the World Physio to further add credibility to the association in its approach with the Health Ministry and the Education Ministry to develop the profession in the country further.

8.1.2 Dynamic Neuromuscular Stabilisation

This will be an introductory course on 31 July 2022. Ms Lim Yi Lin will conduct this at Regen Rehab Hospital

8.1.3 Update on Idiopathic Scoliosis

Mr Thomas will conduct this workshop in August.

8.1.4 Badminton Competition in conjunction with World Physiotherapy Day

To be organized in September 2022. Mr President requested that all members support this activity and make it successful. The gifts were at RM500, RM300 and RM200 for the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places. He hoped to have the members forward the activities to those not connected to the MPA.

8.1.5. National Physiotherapy Conference 17, 18 & 19 March 2023

Mr President aims to have next year's conference in March 2023. Beginning with a Pre-Conference Workshop on 16 March and 17 March 2023 in Women's Health, Paeds and Cardiac Rehab. The President is trying to see which other fields to focus on to encompass as many specialty fields as possible.

8.2 Change in colour of the MPA T-Shirt

Mr Dilip Kumar requested a change to the white MPA T-shirt as he found the white T-shirts were tarnished after a while. Ms Zailene has already designed the T-shirt, it is blue and looks more sporty. The material is microfiber. The President presented a copy of the T-shirt, and all members in attendance approved the new design. The newly designed T-Shirts will be available for the conference in September 2021.

8.3. Payment to one body

Mdm. Genevieve Chan asked if it is possible to pay one body instead of 2, as with the MMC and MMA when ACT 774 comes into force. Mr President mentioned that he had submitted a proposal to the ministry to do just that, but the MPA is the ONLY profession with only one body representing the profession in the whole country. The ministry suggests that once the registration process is done, the profession could have a survey, and if the majority agrees, then it would be possible. The proposal will be reviewed again after the ACT registration is done.

8.4 Certification of Dry Needling in Malaysia

Mdm Chelvi asked if physios are allowed to practice Dry Needling in Malaysia. Mr President explained that he had approached the Ministry (KKM) for the same purpose. The Ministry is asking for data on the number of practitioners and the guidelines in the application. The programs should also be recognized and approved in Malaysia. Once that is available, the MPA will send the data to the ministry for approval. It will require approval from the Credentialing and Privileging committee. If the committee approves it, it should be allowed to be practiced. Mr President hopes that with the formation of the Special Interest Group, they will spearhead the development of SOP's and Guidelines for the Physio profession in Malaysia.

8.5 Physiotherapy specialisation

Mdm Chelvi asked if Cupping is an area of specialization as she is seeing some new interviewees presenting it in their CVs. Mr President clarified that there is a distinction between ACT 774 and ACT 775 (TCM). It is currently not a scope of practice in Act 774. Currently, because ACT 774 is not in force, no action can be taken against those who mix the 2 types of treatment separated by the 2 ACTs. Once the ACT is in force, action can be taken.

8.6 Special Interest Group

Wei Loon thanked the MPA for forming the SIG groups. He asked if it is possible to video record the organized courses and have them available to be viewed by the members at a later date. He also lamented that Webinars are held during work hours and are difficult to attend while at work. The committee found that attendance was low if the webinars were held during the weekend. There was more attendance during the weekday.

Having to place the videos in the system is not feasible as the information will not be exclusive and open to the general public. The EXCO is looking for ways and means to share with MPA members to add value to being members.

8.7 Private companies organizing Physio Courses at exorbitant rates.


Mr Marc Daniel asked if there was a way to regulate courses charging very high prices. Mr President clarified that the only way of controlling the price is if the organizers request CPD points. Currently, MPA has no jurisdiction to regulate this, and it is the prerogative of the physiotherapist to discern what is a good course or of good quality at a reasonable price.

ACT 774 will have sub-divisions for specialization, e.g. under KKM, and there is a Subject Matter Expert (SME) in 7 areas. The areas are neuro, MS, CR, Paeds, Womans Health, Sports, and Palliative/Cancer Rehab. The process will be clearly defined, and only once the therapist completes the full process will they be acknowledged as a Specialist in that Area. All these will only be in force once the registration process for the ACT has been done.

8.3 President's Closing message.

The President thanked all those who attended and again asked all members to promote all events organized by the MPA.

The meeting adjourned at 12 pm.
